

Boroughmuir High School Design Consultation Stakeholder Information - 23 May 2013

Boroughmuir High School's vision is to ensure a confident, nurturing and inclusive learning community where *all* achieve their true potential and embrace life's challenges. Our aim is to help them in this, by creating an inspirational and sustainable school for 1,165 pupils.

The school design must be sensitive to the unique canal-side location but also respond well to the immediate local urban area and ongoing development of the Fountainbridge area and the canal quarter in particular.

Internally the building is organised around a central atrium, providing a variety of teaching and learning areas suitable for different sized groups and educational experiences. The building has dramatic and inspirational spaces that enjoy physical and visual links to the canal and the outside spaces.

With imagination we propose to make best use of this site. Among other features the school (and local community) will enjoy purpose designed performance / assembly space, enhanced sports facilities including a novel roof-top multi-use games area and a higher level external terrace extending from the social/dining space.

Thursday 20 June (7.00pm) at St Bride's Community Centre, Oswald Terrace, EH11 2DZ It is expected that this meeting will focus more on the external design of the building and how our proposals may affect those living locally who will be close to the school site and may have interest in the canal and new park developments.






