At this month's meeting we were able to award over £1,400 to support a range of activities to enhance pupils' experiences, including sports kits, musical instruments and equipment to support wellbeing. We are able to do this thanks to all who support our fundraising activities and who volunteer – thank you! It is a real pleasure to know the difference we make for the kids at SMPS, and if you'd like to play a more active part in this then we'd love to hear from you!

In addition to supporting activities, there has been progress on the playground developments and planning for the younger years to join Comiston Road which was great to hear about.

Chairs' Update

The Chairs have been talking to Leaf and Bean about running a trial to have coffee etc available from the Janitor's House in the playground, probably around pick up and drop off on a Friday, with the intention of creating more opportunities for social mixing at School and to make it feel more of a social space.

The Chairs are also continuing to look into the potential benefits and drawbacks of the Parent Council becoming a registered charity but this decision will not be made until the new chair/ co-chairs are in role in the next academic year.

Recruitment of new co-chairs is ongoing – there is one person who has noted interest, so we are keen to hear from anyone who may be interested in joining them in a co-chair role. Louisa and Ange spoke about how they have enjoyed the role, and working together it has been a manageable and fun experience. They'd both be very happy to chat with anyone interested to see whether it might suit you!

Head Teachers Update

After some careful savings from the School budget, Mr Gillies has been able to spend almost £90,000 on upgrading infrastructure around the School including new IT and laptops for all teachers which connect to the smart screens (28 laptops in total), laptops for PSAs, as well as some refurbishments around the School and playground such as the new solar powered lights in the trees at the front of the School. Because of this, he has spent most of his budget and will be able to transfer the maximum of 1.5% into next year without much being returned to the Council.

He would very much like to extend the IT improvements to iPads for the P5s, but that is a larger project.

Mr Gillies also thanked parents who have been volunteering to support school activities. There are lots of great ways to support the school community through



volunteering a little of your time and Mrs Jones will soon be sending a message out to all parents to ask for more parents to get involved. Some of the ways you could make a difference are:

- Helping with outdoor learning trips
- · Gardening in the playground
- Reading with children

Mr Gillies also updated on his conversations with the Council to confirm the £200,000 - £250,000 committed to improving the toilets, as well as the classrooms and playground areas for P1 and P2 pupils to be at Comiston Road in the future. This is an ongoing discussion, but Mr Gillies did confirm again that after school club will be provided at the school children attend (ie if you are at Comiston Road then your ASC is at Comiston Road). To support this, Spring Oscars are looking into whether they need to/ can extend the club into Greenbank Church as has been done in the past to increase capacity.

Finance update

We received several requests from the school for funding, which we voted on. We were delighted to be able to support:

- New kit for the girls netball team to be able to compete in matching SMPS kit
- New instruments and equipment for strings (strings, bows, a viola, a violin)
- New yoga mats for yoga and mindfulness activities to be started up by Miss Goodchild

We're really pleased to be able to help the School with these activities, to enrich to educational experiences offered. Thank you to all who have given and supported fundraising activities to make this possible!

Transport Update

The transport group updated on current roadworks – the roadworks on Comiston Road are due to end very soon.

There was some comment on the junction at the end of Braidburn Terrace by the Hermitage, which we believe is meant for local access only. Potentially this may need to be reviewed if that is not how is it being used, but there is precedent in the city for better signage to be added to junctions like this.

It was also noted that the Council are deciding the future for the Greenbank to Meadows quiet route, and we are keen to hear the outcome of that decision.
